REQUEST FOR LETTER OF SUPPORT

Dear _____,

Thank you for agreeing to write a letter of support for Hope 4 Children with Epilepsy in our efforts to make a high-CBD/low-THC cannabis extract, called Alepsia, available to children in Utah struggling with intractable epilepsy. We appreciate your efforts on behalf of this important cause.

Alepsia is derived from a hybrid cannabis plant that has been bred to be very low in THC. It does NOT cause a “high”, but it does show great promise in reducing seizures. Children being treated with this medicine are seeing remarkable results with none of the horrible side effects their current medications cause: side effects like organ failure, failure to thrive, thinning of bones, and difficulties in walking, talking and eating on their own. This treatment causes NONE of these.

Reports indicate that 80% of children taking this extract are responding positively, with their seizures being reduced 50% on average. They are also regaining abilities and experiencing an increase in quality of life! We ask that you please address your letter “To whom it may concern:” and provide the following information:

- Your name

Your letter should be written on your official letterhead and include the accepted salutations. This is a general letter of support written for the legislature as well as the public. Please consider this audience when writing.

Try to refrain from using the term ‘medical marijuana’. We are not advocating for that program and we do not want to create confusion. We use the proper description of the extract: high-CBD/low-THC cannabis extract, or Alepsia.

Please describe the reason why you are supporting the use of Alepsia for the treatment of refractory epilepsy in children. Indicate if you would be willing to participate in the approved program and in what role, i.e. prescribing physician, regulatory agency, etc.
